

# CIRCLE2/EEA Adaptation Platform Workshop

## Poster Session

### Aims

Since several platform developers and managers are present, we would like to make the most of your experience and your thoughts and plans. The intention of the poster session is to provide an opportunity for all to share those experiences, challenges and plans thereby facilitating the integration of these into the deliberations during the workshop. We encourage you not to just focus on a general description. Rather we would like you to share your thoughts and challenges related to the themes of the breakout groups

### Poster Content

- Platform name, affiliation (at top) and link to platform, plus contact name and details (at bottom)
- Specific information in terms of challenges and lessons learnt under each of the breakout session themes (see questions under each theme):
  - Relationships with other platforms – reality of collaboration between different scales, relationships with DDR and climate services platforms, and means of collaborating to benefit users
  - User engagements – means of identifying users, reasons for engaging users, extent of engagement, mechanisms for engaging users, identifying needs of users, and roles users have played
  - Case studies – identifying ‘good’ case studies, why do you include case studies, extent to which users are engaged in developing case studies, and case studies as learning cases
  - Practical issues – human and financial resources, nature and scope of platform, timeline for design and stakeholder engagement, technical aspects, validating information, managing user engagement, measuring success, and business case
- Challenges for coming years
- General information in a logical sequence (platform objectives, chronology, main elements and components, governance)

### General guidelines:

- Poster size (100x80 cm?), orientation (standing / landscape) and suggested size and font for text (Readable, but could consider Arial, 20-24) and figure captions
- Figures, including screen shots from platform
- You can provide two posters on two different themes
- If possible, bring A4 size prints of your poster to give out to participants (to be included in the workshop report)

### Integrating posters into workshops

- Poster presenters will be encouraged to raise the relevant points from their posters within the breakout groups in which they are participating.
- During the lunch on Day1, facilitators/leaders and rapporteurs from each of the breakout groups will review the posters for relevant points (challenges and lessons learnt) and create a list that could be posted so as those points will be available within their respective breakout groups.
